RCC BOARD OF GOVERNORS 2008 PREFERENCE POLL RESULTS

RESTON, VA — On Monday, October 20, 2008, at the request of Supervisor Catherine M. Hudgins, the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors appointed three candidates to the nine-member Reston Community Center Board of Governors, all for terms expiring in 2011. The official results of the 2008 RCC Preference Poll resulted in the appointment of returning Board members, Cathy Vivona and William Penniman, and new Board member, John Gasson.

“I believe we have an outstanding Board in place to carry forward the initiatives underway and to meet the challenges of the coming year,” said Bill Bouie, Chairman of the Board of Governors.

John Gasson comes to the RCC Board of Governors following a successful tenure as the President of the Friends of Reston organization that completed fundraising needed to begin construction of the Nature House. He is serving on the RCC Board of Governors for the first time.

William Penniman has been on the RCC Board for the past two years and has served as the treasurer, chair of the Finance Committee and a member of other Board committees. He has been the Board liaison to the YMCA and SLHS. He is also a member of the RA/RCC Joint Task Force studying the potential for collaboration between Reston Association and Reston Community Center to build another recreation facility for Reston.

Cathy Vivona has been on the RCC Board for the past 2 years as chair of the Community Relations committee, and member of other Board committees. She is the Board liaison to Greater Reston Arts Center (GRACE). In addition to Bill Penniman, and fellow Board members, Bill Bouie, Beverly Cosham, and Bill Keefe, Cathy serves on the RA/RCC Joint Task Force. She previously served on past RCC Boards as member, treasurer, and was the RCC Board chair from 1997 to 2001.

RCC board members set policy, adopt the operating budget, attend monthly public meetings, chairs committees and represent RCC at community functions.
