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RCC WANTS TO HEAR FROM RESIDENTS OF SMALL DISTRICT 5 IN COMMUNITY SURVEY

RESTON, VA — Residents of Small District 5 will soon be able to express their views on the Reston Community Center through the 2007 Community Survey. Reston Community Center's Board of Governors Community Relations Committee will once again initiate a community survey. The survey will be conducted by the University of Virginia, Center for Survey Research (a highly recognized survey research institution) beginning on November 6th.

The goal of the survey is to identify key strengths of the RCC and to develop recommendations for improving the Center's programs and services to the community as well as community knowledge of RCC and its offerings. Questions will cover topics such as RCC's mission, role in the community, current and future participation potential, facilities and programs, governance, and demographics.

"The primary purpose for conducting the survey is to use the information we learn so we can deliver outstanding, enhanced services to Small District 5 residents, businesses and employees while increasing value for the tax dollars paid and implementing changes to ensure that we are in step with what the community wants," said Bill Bouie, RCC Board of Governor Chair. "With this information, we can identify our strengths and weaknesses and develop action plans going forward."

"The only way we can learn how we are doing is by asking the people who really know – our residents," said Bonnie Freeman, RCC Executive Director. "We would appreciate resident cooperation when representatives from UVA call with the survey questions." The survey will be administered to 1000 residents. It is very important to the validity of the data compiled that residents contacted respond.
