RCC BOARD OF GOVERNORS ANNOUNCES PREFERENCE POLL RESULTS AND NEW OFFICERS

RESTON, VA — Reston Community Center's Board of Governors is pleased to announce the appointment of three members to its Governing Board. At the request of Hunter Mill District Supervisor Catherine M. Hudgins, the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors appointed three Reston citizens: Beverly Cosham, William Keefe, and Roger Lowen, to the nine-member Reston Community Center Board of Governor for terms expiring in 2013. The appointments were made on the basis of the official results of the 2010 RCC Preference Poll.
